Why We Do What We Do - by Corral 357 President Rich Gomez

We'll October is here – a month we all look forward to and regard for a bunch of reasons...a personal favorite of my wife's and mine, the beginning of fall and the "change" of seasons in Southern California (careful, or you'll miss it!), the beginning of what we all hope is cooler weather, and our now-classic fall Charity Ride (October 20th). That we all love horses, see them as friends, and recognize how much they teach us is clear – what I think is most important is that we look for others who could benefit from this friendship, from this learning and mostly from the feeling we all get from being around and hanging out with horses. We look for a charity to serve; sure a recipient of proceeds but what we're looking for every year is a group that works with children or those who just need a little extra in life. Again this year we have found a wonderful, caring and hard working group that focuses on the care of and treatment for abused and neglected children here in Orange County. The **Canyon Acres Therapeutic Horse Riding Program**.

As a safe haven for the most abused and neglected children in the child welfare system, this 4 1/2 acre facility provides a home in which the children can begin to heal. Located on a ranch in Anaheim Hills, Canyon Acres' Residential Treatment Center provides 24-hour care and treatment for 30 emotionally disturbed children between the ages of 6-12. At "the Ranch", children learn and grow through the use of Day Treatment, Therapeutic Horse Riding, Expressive Arts and Recreation Therapy and other specialized programs. More importantly, they learn and grow due to the love and care of a dedicated staff of professionals who work with and support these children throughout their days and nights.

So be sure and come to our Members' Meeting this month. We're going to have Jacquie Moreland from "The Ranch" and you'll hear first hand how the **Canyon Acres Therapeutic Horse Riding Program** works to provide homes, care, treatment and supportive services for abused, neglected and emotionally troubled children and their families. The best part will be hearing about how horses teach kids the life lessons they teach us everyday.

We're also going to talk about what we need to do and how we need your help to have a successful charity ride. There's much to be done including some trail maintenance before the ride itself so come and sign up! After all, this is really the point of our love of horses...to share the gifts they give us with those less fortunate but so very deserving.
