## DON'T MISS THE EQUINE AFFAIRE BY KAREN HOPKINS-BALTHASER

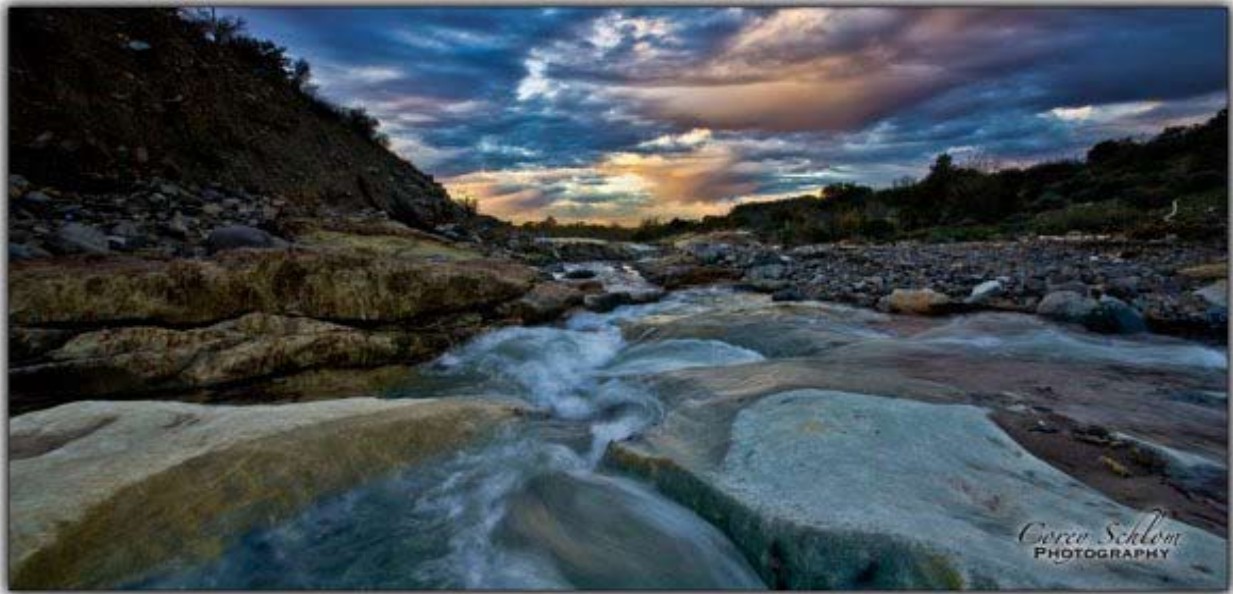
